How We Serve the Community: Our Open Access Initiatives

PAAET has developed a strategic, multi-level approach to community access, ensuring we serve the public effectively while maintaining our primary focus on student education.

1. Access to Our Physical Spaces & Libraries

We open our physical campuses to the community, providing a space for research and collaboration. This on-site access is provided free of charge to registered community members, including non-PAAET learners.

- **Community Library Access:** Alumni and registered members of the public can access our physical library collections for on-site reading and reference.
- Facility Sharing: Through formal partnerships with schools and professional bodies, we provide scheduled access to specialized facilities like computer labs and workshops.

In 2024, more than 500 community members visited our libraries and used learning facilities, and our digital repository recorded over 1000 public downloads of open educational resources.

2. Free Digital Educational Resources (OER)

• Institutional Repository: Our publicly accessible digital repository hosts a wealth of resources, including faculty research, recorded lectures, and specially created Open Educational Resources (OER) like course modules.
